Jesus warned us in John 16:33: “In this world we will have trouble”



It began during Australia's recent catastrophic floods and continued after the cyclones and through the New Zealand earthquake – emails and phone calls asking: 'Surely so many catastrophes in a row mean something is going on? Is it God's judgement?'

Queensland Premier Anna Bligh told us we did not need to worry as this was just nature and not the result of somebody up there who had something against us. One Victorian pastor proclaimed that since ex Prime Minister, Kevin Rudd had spoken against Israel recently, the floods were undoubtedly God's judgement on Queensland because Kevin Rudd is a Queenslander. But then when flooding started in Victoria – was it God's judgement on a Victorian pastor's foolishness? Bligh and her secular buddy, the Prime Minister of Australia Julia Gillard, toured the State of Queensland hand in hand assuring us that we will get through this – we are tough. Atheist Ms Gillard reminded us that mother nature is just so cruel! The tragic Christchurch earthquake was labelled unfair by church goer Kevin Rudd.

But is the recent extreme weather one result of man's global warming activities or is it God's judgement on man's sin? Can we really know when events are the judgement of God, and can we learn anything from these catastrophes about ourselves and about Noah's Flood? Why Noah? Well by the time flooding moved from Rockhampton down the Qld coast to Gympie, where our Jurassic Ark fossil site was badly damaged, then on to Toowoomba with its tragic loss of life, down through the terror of Grantham and on to Brisbane when our DVD studio went under, the *Courier Mail* proclaimed it a “Biblical disaster”. But both Christian and non-Christians suffered – so what's happening?

All the way through the December and January floods none of Australia's political leaders urged us to seek God's help with the weather. Their philosophy must be that everything is natural. Atheist Prime Minister Julia Gillard leads the charge there is no God up there to ask anyway. But can we ever say catastrophes are God's judgement? Some history will help. God told Noah he would “bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and everything that is in the earth shall die.” (Genesis 6:17) We know Noah's Flood was God's judgement simply because God told us it was.

Again when God told Moses to tell Pharaoh, “Tomorrow about this time I will cause it to rain a very grievous hail, such as has not been in Egypt since the foundation thereof even until now.” (Exodus 9:17-18) We know the weather in Egypt was judgement on human rebellion because God told us so. Jesus reminded us in Matthew 5:45-46: “your Father in heaven ...makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust.”

There's no doubt about it - the Bible OT and NT teaches that God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit does control the weather, does send the rain, does send the drought, the floods, and the earthquakes. We know why only iff He tells us! When He doesn't - we can only guess. But the fact that the God who sends the rain is also the God of law and order, is what makes weather forecasting possible. Weather does work according to law and order, and our weakness in weather forecasting is not due to the lack of law and order in climate, but to the interaction of so many “laws” involved with making weather, that we haven't figured it out yet.

By Jesus day the Jews regarded any individual's suffering as God's judgement for a sin. Jesus purpose in answering the disciples' question about whose sin caused one man to be born blind (John 9 :1-3), was to remind them that not only did nobody's sin cause that blindness, but that God as Creator was and is entitled to even use what we think of as affliction (blind from birth) in order to bring glory to Himself and get people saved who otherwise would never perceive a far worse problem – we are all born spiritually blind and need a Saviour to restore our sight. Jesus warned us in John 16:33: “In this world we will have trouble”, and there is no doubt that all suffering is a result of the long term effects of God's judgement on Adam's sin, but God's Word teaches us that an individual's sins may have nothing to do with what has happened to them – be it bad or good.

Some things got totally out of perspective during the floods in Queensland. On January 11th, we Aussies were so consumed with our struggle to stay afloat – that the Brazilian floods which killed more than 800 people on the same day, were almost unreported. Likewise our fear of massive cyclone Yasi during February completely hid us from the fact that it killed nobody, yet 410 people did die in the March 1899 cyclone at Bathurst Bay Qld. No wonder Lord Christopher Monkton in *The Australian* (January 22nd, 2011), said “the forest fires in Russia and southern Australia and the flood in Pakistan and Eastern Australia, were far from the worst ever. (“Earth's crisis ain't necessarily so”)

One thing that should be learnt from tragedies is that death is never far from any of us.

Watching the tragic funeral of Jordan Rice (13), who asked rescuers to save his brother Blake (10) we wept at the all too short a life, at his unexpected unexpected going, and the willing sacrifice of an elder brother to save a younger one. It reminds us we all need a more important saving by our elder brother Jesus.

What was noticeably lacking in media reporting, was any Christian comment – with one major exception - the funeral of the Matthews' family mum and dad. Older brother Nash (20) pushed his sister Victoria (15) into the ceiling as flood waters tore through their house at Spring Bluff. Mum and Dad were washed out the back. The media reported: “The Christian couple were sent 2 kilometres downstream to their final resting place.” Victoria put on her Facebook page; “My family are at peace, knowing that my parents are not suffering and are in a better place with their Father in heaven, but we shall miss them greatly...We are comforted by the lord for he has given us strength.” (CM page 7 and Weekend Magazine Jan 22-23)

The media picked the Noah's Flood theme with the Greenies climate web calling them “Biblical Australian floods” and the *Courier Mail* listing the event as a 'Biblical Disaster'. But their version of 'biblical' sadly reflects those pathetic theologians who describe Noah's Flood as a local back up of the creeks in Babylon, instead of the global flood which covered all the highest hills under the whole of heaven described in Genesis 6–9. Nevertheless, the little Aussie floods we saw sweeping hectares of land from farms and covering whole houses in 20 minutes, and gouging huge sections of Murphy's Creek, can teach us a lot. Why didn't people have time to build a boat and save themselves during Noah's Flood? They didn't have time in this flood either and the water in Noah's day would have been much faster. People asking how long it took the Grand Canyon to form, can just look at the 30 minute valley size washouts in Murphy's Creek. Then there was the rainbow which brilliantly appeared after the cessation of rain, as a reminder God has kept His promise to never again flood the whole world.

We can use such catastrophes to ask what sins are we guilty of, which do deserve God's judgement as a nation or as individuals. Let's start with an atheist Prime Minister who lives in the Lodge with her boyfriend, unmarried, at tax payers' expense, and who is pro-feminist, pro-abortion, pro-homosexual – supported by her Labour colleagues such as Anna Bligh who refuses to acknowledge anybody up there, along with political colleagues such as openly declared lesbian Penny Wong and the openly homosexual Green Bob Brown. God despises all of these things and they do deserve His judgement. How do we know? The same way we know He sent the rain in Noah's day to judge the people. He told us so in His Word the Bible!

Such morally bankrupt leadership in this nation is a reminder that God's judgement has already fallen. Remember that humbling verse God spoke through the prophet when He said “my ways are higher than your ways” (Isaiah 55:9). Consider what else God declared as you watch an increasing number of women take positions of authority in this country. God said through Isaiah (3:12-13): “As for my people, children are their oppressors and women rule over them. The Lord stands up to plead. The Lord stands to judge the people.” Yes we do deserve God's judgement as a nation!

But far more important than trying to figure out what judgement should be meted out to non-Christians in this country – the Scripture says judgement begins at the house of God (1 Peter 4:17-18) on those who should know best. So what sins are you and I and the church of God guilty of? One is notably obvious. Many political leaders have no respect for the authority of God or the power of His Word because many men of God over the past 50 years have increasingly backed away from speaking with the authority of God's Word as truth, as history, and as revelation, commencing in Genesis and finishing in Revelation. They have wimped away from standing firm on the Word of God in family, in Church and in Community. They have compromised with evolution. They have abandoned Noah's Flood as a global judgement and they water down the coming judgement by fire of that Peter records in 2 Peter 3:10-13: “But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in all holy conversation and godliness, Looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat? Nevertheless we, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwells righteousness.”
